### Learning Intention

February promises an exciting adventure in preschool as we embark on a journey to meet the ultimate *real* Superhero, Jesus! Preschoolers will explore who He is, what He did, and why He matters most. Our learning intentions include:

- To introduce preschoolers to Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and understand His love for them
- To discover the amazing things Jesus did through stories and creative play
- To learn about Jesus' character and how He can be our role model
- To build a foundation of faith and love for Jesus that will grow throughout their lives.

### Learning Outcome

1. **Who is Jesus?:** Preschoolers will learn that Jesus is the Son of God, sent to Earth to show us God's love. They will sing along to "Jesus You're My Superhero" and discover how Jesus is different from other superheroes in the movies.
2. **Feeding the 5,000:** We'll travel back in time to witness Jesus's miraculous act of feeding thousands with just five loaves and two fish offered by a boy. This story teaches us about sharing, faith, and God's power and abundant provisions.
3. **Calming the Storm:** When the waves and the seas get rough, Jesus is there to calm the chaos. Preschoolers will learn that Jesus has power over nature and can bring peace even in the midst of storms.
4. **Healing the Ten Lepers:** Jesus is love. His compassion shines through as He heals ten lepers, reminding us that He loves everyone, no matter their circumstances. This story teaches empathy, forgiveness, and God's healing power.
