<p><b>26-27 JUNE</b>  <b>Daniel's Diet</b>                      Daniel 1</p>	<p><b>Overview:</b> The resolve of Daniel and his friends to eat vegetables instead of eat food that had been offered to idols was an example of young men who had prepared ahead of time to obey God no matter what happened.</p> <p><b>Underpin:</b> What have been your greatest temptations? Before temptation comes, we need to determine that loving and obeying God is what we want to do. We can ask God to show us our own weaknesses and give us the strength to do what is right when temptation strikes. There is no temptation we face that God will not give us strength to overcome (1 Corinthians 10:13). <p><b>5-6 JUNE</b>  <b>Fiery Furnace friends</b>                      Daniel 3:13-30</p>	<p><b>Overview:</b> In the fiery ordeal that Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego went through, God was with them and He went through it with them. The lesson is that through life's fiery trials and ordeals, God will never leave us nor forsake us (Heb 13:5). He is ever present in times of trouble as Psalm 46:1 says, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble."</p> <p><b>Underpin:</b> A faithful believer is reliable, steadfast, and unwavering. A faithful believer humbly obeys God, serves others, and seeks the Lord in prayer (Habakkuk 2:4). Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were faithful in the face of the punishment of the fiery furnace. <p><b>12-13 JUNE</b>  <b>Daniel and the Lion's Den</b>                      Daniel 6</p>	<p><b>Overview:</b> Even though Daniel was an old man at the time, he refused to take the easy way out and abandon God. The threat of an agonizing death did not change his trust in God. Daniel's name means "God is my judge," and in this miracle, God, not men, judged Daniel and found him innocent.</p> <p><b>Underpin:</b> You might be enduring your own personal "den of lions" right now, but remember that your circumstances are never a reflection of how much God loves you. The key is not to put your focus on your situation but on your all-powerful Protector. <p><b>19-20 JUNE</b>  <b>The Writing on the Wall</b>                      Daniel 5</p>	<p><b>Overview:</b> After the death of Nebuchadnezzar, Belshazzar (the acting ruler) held a drunken feast. To add excitement to the party, he called for the golden goblets that had been taken from the temple in Jerusalem many years before. The revellers praised their false gods and used the holy temple objects to drink wine from. A human hand appeared from nowhere and wrote on the wall. None of the king's court could interpret the writing so Daniel was brought to the feast. Daniel interpreted the writing to mean that Belshazzar and the kingdom would fall.</p> <p><b>Underpin:</b> Daniel faithfully served God. He also faithfully and honestly served the kings of Babylon. He was not afraid to deliver God's messages to them, even when they were not easy for the king to accept. God calls us to be His servants and share His words with others.
